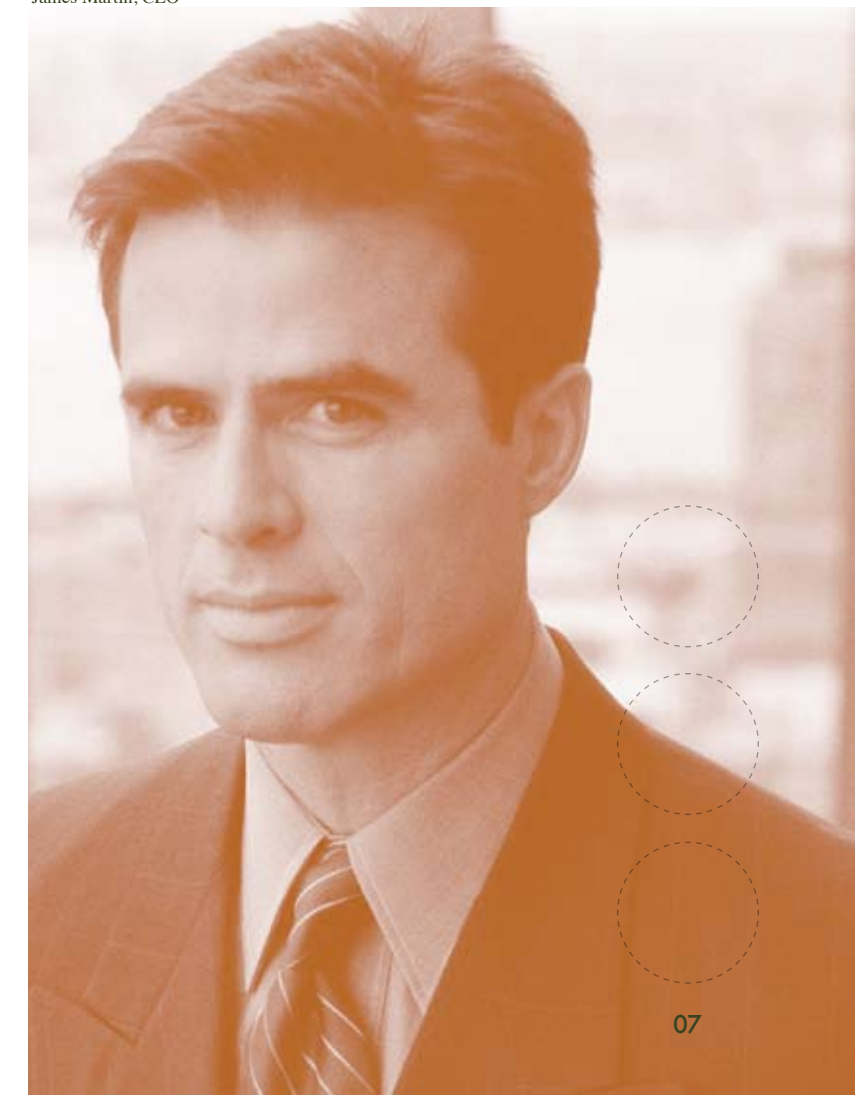
Securing a Future for **All** Living Things

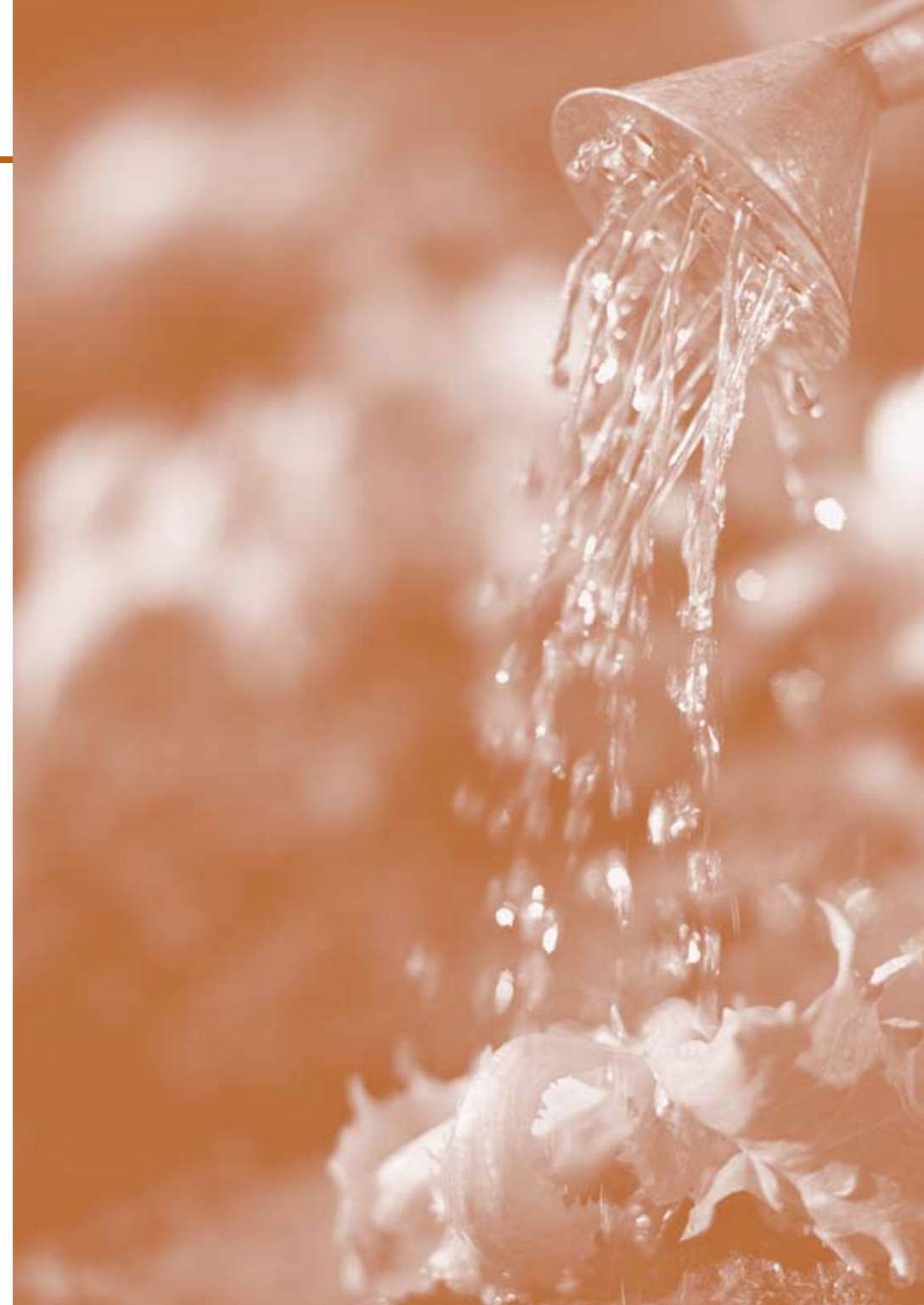
It Begins with **Respect**
